<b>Advocates for Homeless &amp; Those in Need</b>	Program to be discontinued due to unanticipated major loss of funding	<b>\$7,500</b>	Helped continue program & provide life sustaining services to 70 women experiencing homelessness
<b>Career Wardrobe</b>	One-time opportunity to enlarge space and meet increasing demand for their services	<b>\$9,500</b>	Provided professional attire and job readiness services to 4,845 women
<b>Community Legal Services</b>	Re-institute The Working Group to Enhance Services for Incarcerated Women after the lead organization running the program shifted gears	<b>\$10,000</b>	Supported coordinated advocacy for incarcerated women across Philadelphia and Pennsylvania
<b>HIAS Pennsylvania</b>	Sudden increase in demand for relational violence protection services for immigrant communities in Chester County	<b>\$10,000</b>	Expanded legal services for 30 immigrant survivors of interpersonal violence
<b>Home of the Sparrow</b>	Roof damaged due to storm, threatening displacement of residents	<b>\$7,500</b>	Maintained shelter and life supportive services for pre-senior women (ages 55-62) facing homelessness
<b>Interim House</b>	Broken heater caused need for temporary displacement of residents	<b>\$6,585</b>	Continued holistic substance abuse treatment for 24 clients during an emergency relocation
<b>Lutheran Settlement House</b>	Unexpected eviction from their emergency homeless shelter	<b>\$9,250</b>	Relocated to a new facility with minimal disruption to the provision of critical services to 29 families experiencing homelessness
<b>Pennsylvania Health Access Network</b>	Protect access to healthcare for women and families in SE Pennsylvania following a 90% reduction in the advertising budget for ACA Open Enrollment	<b>\$10,000</b>	Highlighted the importance of enrolling in and maintaining healthcare coverage to 6,825 women through various media campaigns
<b>Take Action Philly</b>	Protection of immigrant and refugee populations in Philadelphia following the Travel Ban and threats to sanctuary cities	<b>\$5,000</b>	250 lawyers were trained how to provide pro bono legal advice to immigrant and refugee communities
<b>Therapy Center of Philadelphia</b>	Spike in demand for mental health care in the trans community	<b>\$10,000</b>	Expanded access to low cost psychotherapy services to 50 transgender individuals
