Valley Youth House	Loss of funding and an increase in need for safe short-term housing for female-identifying youth experiencing homelessness or Domestic Violence	\$10,000	Provided 7 female-identifying individuals and 3 children with hotel vouchers for immediate safe housing. 4 entered long-term shelter, 2 moved into subsidized housing, and 1 returned to living in her car, having declined entering shelter.
Orion Communities	Increase in demand for rental assistance and bridge case management services and decrease in resources from partner organizations.	\$10,000	Provided women-led households with rental assistance and other bills (utility etc.) as well as bridge case management services such as subsidized childcare for women returning to work,
Cultural Institute of Health and Education Inc	Increase in demand for the free Phlebotomy Certification Course for women of color.	\$10,000	Provided uniforms, lab bags, books, and lab skills equipment for 30 unemployed women of color to participate in the free Phlebotomy Certification Course, creating stable career options for women of color and increasing WOC representation in the field of healthcare.
The Everywhere Project	Unexpected loss of in-kind donations of prepackaged and nonperishable nutritious foods due to discontinuation from the donor as well as loss of in-kind donations of pre-made, packaged sandwiches due to a fire.	\$10,000	Providing nutritious meals to over 4,000 women and their families at TEP's weekly distribution sites.
Puentes de Salud	Significant unanticipated increase in demand from clients requiring financial support for basic needs.	\$10,000	Providing 40 – 50 single mothers with children with food, transportation, and housing which they cannot access through traditional social safety net programs due to undocumented status. .
Ardella's House	Leak in basement preventing residents from moving into their transitional living facility for women returning from prison.	\$10,000	Installed a Full French Drain System, Full Vapor Barrier System, Mold treatment, and 2 Hp pumps. Additionally made repairs to the damaged drywall and flooring providing secure housing for 250 women returning from incarceration.
Legacy Treatment Services	Increase in demand for case management and a decrease in funding for women with mental illness experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.	\$10,000	Providing short-term housing for women and families transitioning out of homelessness or psychiatric care. 10 families will receive 3-day hotel stays and 5 families will receive 30-day transitional housing stays coupled with case management services to help them shift to a more stable living environment.

Women's Opportunities Resource Center (WORC)	Enterprise-wide tech server unexpectedly and repeatedly crashing.	\$10,000	Replaced server and added a secondary firewall, enabling employees to access the shared drive and all data and documents needed to successfully serve their clients.
