| NewView Institute | Boiler broke at their community headquarters, preventing them from providing services. | \$10,000 | Purchased and installed new boiler which enabling them to provide individual counseling, coaching, and psycho-educational groups for women and girls experiencing Intimate Partner Violence. |
| Planned Parenthood Keystone | Decrease in Title X funding which provides charitable care for patients otherwise not able to afford services. | \$10,000 | Fully cover the cost of 100 patients' care. |
| Why Not Prosper | Heat stopped working due to corroded pipes in a mostly inaccessible crawl space despite performing all required maintenance. | \$10,000 | Replaced pipes and fixed damage caused by the system's depressurization enabling them to continue their transitional residential program for formerly incarcerated women as well as their resource center which serves 160 women. |
| Safe Way Out | Loss of funding to provide emergency housing to survivors of Domestic / Intimate Partner Violence | \$10,000 | Providing emergency temporary housing to 50 women and children fleeing Domestic / Intimate Partner Violence. |
| Lutheran Settlement House | Increase in demand for emergency housing services for Domestic Abuse Survivors as well as an increase in the amount of funding needed per survivor. | \$10,000 | Providing urgent housing related needs for survivors of Domestic Violence including, but not limited to: security deposits, moving costs back-rent (to prevent eviction), short-term rent support, and lock changes. |
| Esteem Girls Inc. | Loss of funding was threatening the continuation of their programming. | \$9,600 | Providing STEM programming to girls through a full-time stem summer camp and Introduce a Girl to Engineering on Saturdays for 6 months. |
| Immigrant Rights Action | Unexpected increase in demand for services: 120% increase for walk-in clients and 60% increase in phone calls. | \$10,000 | Refugee and Immigrant clients will have access to health care and legal options in the client's native languages. |
